



Interested in learning about the NIH Grants Process? Join this webinar designed for beginners.

As anyone who has ever tried knows, navigating the extensive National Institutes of Health can be overwhelming! From understanding the difference between the Institutes and Centers that make up the NIH to what a “Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO)” is versus a “Notice of Special Interest,” to even knowing which person an applicant should talk to about their grant application, it can feel incredibly onerous to even know where to start. For those of you who are new to working with the NIH grants process, you may want to attend the NIH’s upcoming webinar on Wednesday, May 15, entitled “NIH Grants Process: A Brief Walk-Through for Beginners.” In this webinar, NIH will explain the organizational structure of the NIH and how it funds research, explain how to find NOFOs that are the right fit for your project, provide an overview of the grants process and peer review, and more.

The webinar will be hosted by the NIH Office of Extramural Research and the Center for Scientific Review. The 1.5-hour webinar will start with a brief recording covering the basics and will be followed by more than an hour of live Q&A with NIH experts.
